Marg reported that there has been some vandalism taking place in the village such as the Curling club being broken into and ad bags being scattered throughout the village. Such instances should be reported to Community Policing.

6.10 City representative - Linda Payant

Linda reported that there will be a public meeting at 7:00 p.m. tomorrow night at the Old City Hall in Cumberland for members of the public to take part in the budget process. There are around 60 options on the budget document for everything from staff cuts to increase of user fees. Linda spoke about the Mayor's report and new ideas being proposed. This can be viewed on the City website. Mr. Quinn commented that he would like to congratulate Rob Jellett on doing a good job of staying out of much of the rancor surrounding the budget debate. Question was also raised about the road works taking place on the three roads leading into Orleans simultaneously. Linda will look into this.

## 7. **New Business**

7.1 Adam Brown from Rural Affairs Office

Dean Johnson replaced Adam Brown as the representative from the Rural Affairs Office. He explained the role of the three members of his office and gave a brief overview of subjects covered by them from zoning by-laws and the fact that they will be involved in the amalgamation of all municipality zoning by-laws into one city Comprehensive Zoning By-law. He also spoke to the Rural Discussion White Paper reports which were written by community groups on various topics and which are available through the city website. He stated that they would also be available to assist with the Navan Design Plan. He suggested the first step should be to visit the City website, and from that we can see the zoning on each individual property.

7.2 Leonard Tavern

This tavern, dating back to the early 1800s, together with the bar, will be moved and set up in the Cumberland museum to be used as a walk-in bar and also garden area. The Navan and Cumberland Lions have put in their money from the Power show to assist with the move. Marg asked if the Navan Community Association could also help with this venture. Phil Grandmaitre made a motion to donate \$350.00. This was seconded by Carol Quinn and carried by the remaining members.

7.3 Heritage Power Show

Hal MacPherson spoke about this event which will be run by the Cumberland and Navan Lions next year, May 30, 31<sup>st</sup> and June 1, 2008. Last year this event encompassed a country show, and giant flea market. Volunteers are needed on committees so if you are interested call Hal at 835-3502.
